# **Brief History of the College**

aja Birendra Chandra College, formerly known as Kandi Raj College of Commerce was established in the year 1965 to cater Commerce education to the students of Kandi subdivision in particular and students of adjoining area of Kandi subdivision. Raja Birendra Chandra College of Commerce was first affiliated to the University of Calcutta. However, in 1998 it came under the University of Kalyani. Late Kumar Jagadish Chandra Sinha, the then President of Kandi Raj College of commerce trust and educational endowment of the Kandi Raj family donated Rs. 26000/- (twenty-six thousand) on behalf of the said trust fund for the proposed Raja Birendra Chandra College of Commerce. In this way the dream of establishing a Commerce college came to reality. When the college started its journey, it had no building of its own. Classes were usually held in the premises of Kandi Raj College in the evening. But thanks to all out efforts of the college authority, especially Sri Monoranjan Ghosh (Ex Teacher-in-Charge of the College). The college was shifted to its present site in the year 1998. But sharp declining in the number of students at that time raised question regarding the sustainability of the college. On the other hand, there was long term demand from the students and newly appointed teachers to introduce Arts stream at the degree level. Keeping those things in mind and to make the college viable the then college authority introduced general Arts stream at the degree level from 1998. Honours courses (in Bengali, History, Sanskrit, English and Geography) were introduced later on. From then the college was renamed as Raja Birendra Chandra College and started functioning as a full-fledged college for Arts and Commerce in the day shift. It is needless to say that introduction of Arts stream is a new era in the history of the development of the college. At present, the number of students on roll is nearly 2000. Page:2

### **LOCATION**

The College is located in the prime location of Kandi, Murshidabad and easily accessible by public transport. The College is five to seven minutes' walking distance from Kandi Bus stand.

#### **INFRASTRUCTURE**

Raja Birendra Chandra College building is situated at the heart of the city. The eastern side of the campus consists of two storied buildings where canteen and Boys' common room is situated at the ground floor and an ICT room is located at the first floor.



In the northern side of the college there are buildings. The first three storied building consists of classrooms and the second storied building two comprises of classroom (College Hall) the in ground floor and the laboratory of physical education department

along with gymnasium in the first floor.

Two buildings, one single storied and another four storied are situated in the southern side. The first building houses classrooms, NSS room & students' union room and the second building consists of classrooms in the ground floor, office and Girls' common room in the first floor, college library in the second floor and classroom in the third floor respectively. In addition, the western side and a part of the northern side of the campus includes a large building comprising of classrooms in the ground floor and the first floor is used for the office room, Principal's room, computer room, room for IQAC and teachers' room.

# **OUTLINE OF NEP-2020**

### One of the Transformative Initiatives in Higher Education

**Undergraduate Degree Programmes** of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple entry and exit points and re-entry options, with appropriate certifications such as:

- a UG Certificate after completing 1 year (2 Semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study,
- a UG Diploma after 2 years (4 Semesters) of study,
- a Bachelor's Degree after a 3-year (6 Semesters) programme of study,
- a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) after a 4-year (8 Semesters) programme of study. If the students complete a rigorous research project/ dissertation in their major area(s) of study in the 4th year of a bachelor's degree then (Honours with Research).

### Summer Internship /Apprenticeship (2 - 4 credits):

Community engagement and service, Field-based learning/Minor Project. A key aspect of the new UG programme is induction into actual work situations. All students will also undergo internships / Apprenticeships in a firm, industry, or organization or Training in labs with faculty and researchers in their own or other HEIs/research institutions during the summer term.

❖ Semester: It consists of 15-18 weeks of academic work equal to 90 actual teaching days. The odd Semester from July-Dec. & even from Jan. to June.

- \* Academic Year: Two consecutive (Odd + Even) semester constitute in a Year.

### **College Library:**

In the field of higher education, the town Kandi is adorned by Raja Birendra



Chandra College. The library is the repository of knowledge of an institution. An academic library refers to a library which is situated in the premises of a higher educational institution and which serves the dual purposes of supporting the curriculum and research work. The Central Library of Raja Birendra Chandra College was established in the year1965. It is situated on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor. The students, teaching and non-

The no. of total books in the central library is 18844 (according to Accession Register). The entire library is under the surveillance of CCTV. The library will take a membership of UGC-NLIST consortium very shortly. Besides the syllabus related books, reference books are

also available in the central library.

College Office and library are computerized for their all types of activities. College has broadband Internet facility in the office, and teachers' room. Apart from this, computer and internet facilities for students are available in library and the laboratory of Geography department.

### Canteen & sufficient drinking water:

There are two separate canteens in Raja Birendra Chandra College- one for the students and other for the college staff. Both the canteens are equipped with well-

spaced seating arrangements. A variety of nutritious and hygienically prepared foods are available in the canteens at reasonable prices. An ample supply of fresh drinking water is always available in the canteens.

### **Scholarships:**

As per existing Government rules, various scholarships



from Government of West Bengal and Government of India like Swami Vivekananda Merit Cum Means Scholarship (SVMCM), Post Matric Scholarship for SC/ST students, Kanyasree Prakalpa, Aikyashree Prakalpa, National Scholarship (Central Sector Scheme of Scholarships for College and University Students) etc. are allotted among meritorious, poor, Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, Other Backward Classes and female students. The college takes positive steps to help students to get these scholarships.

for the healthy development, physically and psychologically, to all students. To achieve these objectives a committee has been constituted. Thus, our motto is:
